5. r. 6 “*eis*”: Qui sunt *ei*?
6. r. 7-10: Cur Romani tamen pugnam inierunt?
7. r. 7-10: Cur Sabinae feminae se inter tela inferunt?
8. r. 7-10: Quos orabant Sabinae feminae?
9. r. 11-14: Sine quibus vivere nolunt feminae Sabinae?
10. r. 11-14 : Quarum verba Romanos et Sabinos moverunt?

### D. Translate the following story into Latin:

1. The Romans lived without war together with the Sabines, who had fought the Romans earlier.
2. Their love for their king, who had founded the town, was great.
3. But once upon a time the people, who had come together to the field of Mars (= *Campus Martius*) with Romulus, suddenly were very afraid.
4. The sky was dark and there came a powerful (= big) wind.
5. After the light came back, Romulus, who had been sitting on his throne, was suddenly gone.
6. The Romans, who loved the Romans very much, were frightened and sad.
7. Later, a man, whose name was Proculus Julius, said to the people:
8. “Friends! Today Romulus came down to me from heaven
9. and he ordered me: ‘Tell the Romans, that the gods love Rome! (*aci*)
10. The town, that I founded, will be (= *erit*) the capital (= *caput*) of the world (= *mundus*)!’ ”
11. Because of the words Proculus spoke, the Romans were no longer sad.
12. After that the Romans worshipped Romulus like a god.
